Rationale

O.C.G.A. § 20-2-260 (c) (2) requires that the State Board of Education approve all five-year local facilities plans for local school systems to be able to participate in the State Capital Outlay Program.

The listed school systems have completed a new five-year plan as required by O.C.G.A. § 20-2-260 (c) (2). The five-year local facilities plan has been reviewed by a Comprehensive Facilities Survey Team consisting of administrators from other school systems. The Comprehensive Facilities Survey Team has recommended the five year local facilities plan be approved for the listed counties.

State Board Rule 160-5-4-.01 – Educational Facilities Construction Plan (Local Facilities Plan). The respective Comprehensive Facilities Survey Teams have recommended that these five-year plans be approved.
