2005 Game Recap

Jeffries pitches South to inaugural victory

Jada Jeffries (SW DeKalb) struck out a record setting 16 batters and the south scored three runs in the bottom of the first inning on the way to an 8-1 victory over the South in the inaugural DeKalb County All-Star Softball Classic.

Abby Nicholas (Redan) singled in one run and Jeffries had an RBI ground out to score another as the South jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the first inning.

Jefferies, who was named the South's MVP for the game, pitched seven shutout innings to start the game and allowed only one run in the game, on an RBI double by North MVP BJ Yarbrough of Stone Mountain.

The South added a run in the fifth on Nicholas' second RBI single of the game and three more in the seventh as three errors and a RBI double by RaeShawn Hall (SW DeKalb) contributed to the inning.

Latisha Seaborn (Towers) closed out the scored with a RBI single in the bottom of the eighth.

Jeffries finished the game with the All-Star record 16 strikeouts, allowing just four hits one run and one walk in nine innings.

Yarbrough led the North with her 2-2 performance at the plate against Jeffries, one double and one RBI. She also pitched three innings of relief allowing one earned run and 3 hits.

Payne, North All-Stars defeat South All-Stars 7-2

Dunwoody's Brandi Payne struck out 15 to lead the North to a 7-2 victory over the South in the Second Annual DeKalb County Softball All-Star Classic on Sunday at Redan High School.

Payne allowed just 2 unearned runs, five hits and one walk as she dominated the South batters in the complete game victory.

The South's Shakira Pledger (M.L. King) earned the South MVP award by going four innings with six strikeouts, one walk and one unearned run before leaving the mound.

The game was tied 1-1 heading into the top of the seventh inning when the North broke through against M.L. King's Patrice Bailey for three runs.

Singles by Lakeside's Lauren Levin and Dunwoody's Marissa Handley followed by an intentional walk to Brandi Payne to load the bases brought Lakeside's Brianna Stripling to the plate. Stripling came up with the clutch two-out hit by stroking a bases-clearing triple to right to give the North a 4-1 lead they would never relinquish.

Handley, who finished 3-4 at the plate, extended the lead to 6-1 with a two-out single in the top of the eighth to plate a pair of runs.

Lakeside's Lauren Levin finished 2-4 on the day to aid the North cause.

Redan's Robyn Cathey was 2-3 with a triple and run scored to lead the South at the plate.

M.L. King's Patrice Bailey took the loss for the South by allowing three runs on three hits while striking out three and walking only one.

The win by the North evened up the series at 1-1. Brandi Payne's 15 strikeouts was one off the record of 16 set by Jada Jeffries of Southwest DeKalb in the South's 8-1 win in the inaugural All-Star Classic last year.

South All-Stars defeat North All-Stars 17-2

The South All-Stars took advantage of 13 walks by the North All-Stars' pitching staff on the way to an easy 17-2 victory in the Third Annual DeKalb County Senior All-Star Softball Classic on Saturday morning at Redan High School.

Five of the 13 walks came in the top of the first inning as the North's drafted starting pitcher, Jasmine Brown of Chamblee playing in place of teammate Allie Jest who was unable to play Saturday, struggled finding the plate after giving up a lead-off single to Southwest DeKalb's Raven Johnson.

Three walks, two wild pitches and one error later it was 2-0 and brought Martin Luther King High's Ashley Jennings to plate and she promptly delivered a two-run single to make it 4-0. Two more walks and two errors contributed to four more runs in the inning as the South made it 8-0 before the North squad even got to the plate.

Dunwoody's Chantelle Statham got the North off to a good start with a bunt single to start the bottom half of the inning, but injured her leg on the close play at first and Miller Grove's Afton Leak came on to pinch-run. Leak quickly made her presence known by stealing second and following a South error she teamed up with Brown for a double steal to score the first of the North's two runs in the game.

McNair's Brittany Webb extended the lead to 9-1 in the top of the second inning with a two-out, RBI single to score Jennings.

Statham singled again in the bottom of the third and with Leak running again used an error and a pair of wild pitches to score the final run for the North.

A pair of RBI singles coming of the bats of Brittany Webb and Raven Johnson contributed to a four-run fifth inning to close out the scoring as the game came to an end in the fifth.

Lithonia's D'Shena Rayford went all five innings allowing just three hits and two runs to get the win for the South.

Ashley Jennings finished 2-3 at the plate with two RBI, scored three runs, drew one walk and made a couple of nice catches on the run in the center field to earn the South's MVP honors and was followed closely by McNair's Brittany Webb who finished 2-4 with three RBI.

Chantelle Statham went 2-3 at the plate and accounted for both of the North's runs in the game while also pitching the final two innings of the game to earn the North's MVP award.

The victory gives the South All-Stars a 2-1 lead in the series.

The South All-Stars won their second consecutive game in the All-Star Softball Classic 15-2 over the North to take a commanding 3-1 lead in the series.

Dunwoody's Haley Stevenson worked out of jams in the first three innings allowing just two unearned runs to keep the North in the game down just 2-0 heading into the bottom of the fourth.

The South then took advantage of six North errors and three walks to explode for 10 runs behind a two-run triple by South MVP Cinnamon Bell of Southwest DeKalb and a RBI single by Bell's Lady Panther teammate Shannon Baity. The lead had ballooned to 12-0 heading into the top of the fifth.

The North then took advantage of four South errors and Stone Mountain's Jasmine Watkins, the North MVP, nailed a pitch from Bell that glanced away and past the infield to drive in a pair of runs for the North. Lauren Sneed from Tucker then reached on a fielder's choice, stole second and scored on an error to close the gap to 12-3 heading into the bottom of the fifth.

The South picked up three-more runs in the bottom of the fifth on three hits and another error to make the final of 15-3.

Bell finished the game with nine strikeouts and one walk allowed in six innings while going 1-2 at the plate with a triple and two RBIs to earn MVP honors for the South. She also scored three runs and reached base in all four plate appearances.

North breaks South's two-game streak

Tucker's Andrea Cole struck out seven batters in three innings and was 3-3 with three RBI at the plate to lead the North All-Stars to a 13-7 victory over the South in the fifth annual DeKalb County Softball Senior All-Star Classic on Thursday at Miller Grove High School.

The North's victory pulled within 3-2 in the series and broke the South's two-game win streak.

Cole entered the game to pitch in the top of the fourth inning with the North trailing 5-3 and promptly struck out two of the three batters she faced to set the South down in order.

The North then exploded for nine runs in the bottom of the fourth to take command of the game as the first nine batters reached base and scored on the way to a 12-5 lead.

Dunwoody's Meagan Angstadt and Lakeside's Laura Gardner each delivered two-run singles in the big inning. Cole added her second RBI single of the game while Clarkston's Belan Hamad was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded to drive in another run and Dunwoody's Cara Caputo drew a bases-loaded walk for another RBI.

Cole added her third RBI single in the fifth inning to make it 13-5 before Martin Luther King's Kerri Eubanks worked out of a bases loaded jam without allowing another run.

Imani Cabell of Southwest DeKalb reached on a bunt single in the sixth, stole second and scored on a throwing error that allowed Miller Grove's Tyler Jackson to advance to third. Jackson later scored as a

strikeout pitch was dropped and the batter was thrown out at first to make the final of 13-7.

The South broke a 2-2 tie with three runs in the third inning as Jade Nelson and Nikkea Rembert of Miller Grove drove in a run each on ground outs in the inning keyed by a lead off double by Southwest DeKalb's Davynn Brown.

Cole allowed just two hits (both bunt singles), walked one, struck out seven and allowed two unearned runs to get the win for the North and earn the North MVP honors. Cole tied the record for hits in a game with three and also for RBI with 3.

Stephenson's Alex Taylor was 2-2 with a walk, stolen base and a run scored to earn the South MVP award.

Nikkea Rembert had two RBI in the game for the South. Laura Gardner was 2-2 with two RBI and Meagan Angstadt was 2-3, scored two runs and had two RBI to aid the North victory.

South All-Stars rally to nip North All-Stars 12-11

Southwest DeKalb's Elexica Simmons slapped a one-out, RBI single in the bottom of the eighth inning to complete a 10-run rally by the South to overtake the North 12-11 in the sixth annual DeKalb County Senior All-Star Softball Classic at Dunwoody on Monday.

The South trailed 11-2 heading into the bottom of the eighth inning as darkness was cutting the game an inning short. Lakeside's Mallory Mayhew had struck out the side as she took the mound in the bottom of the seventh, but found herself with bases loaded in the top of the eighth.

A bases-loaded walk was followed by three consecutive hits by the South, including two-run singles by Redan's Sydney Mason and Martin Luther King Jr.'s Taylor Jones, to close the gap to 11-8.

North starter Erin Bell of Chamblee returned to the mound to try to stop the rally after pitching the first six innings, striking out 10, walking none while allowing two unearned runs. Two batters later McNair's Charlotte Howard drilled a RBI triple to center and the South had pulled within one at 11-10.

An error on an infield grounder off the bat of McNair's Quanita Mateen tied the game at 11. Southwest DeKalb's Imani Gayle singled and Mateen was thrown out trying to advance to third for the first out to bring Simmons to the plate for the game-winning hit.

Dunwoody's Alison Gura and Chamblee's Katie Kinsella both drove in a pair of runs with big hits off winning pitcher Imani Gayle who had struck out 14 over the first six innings despite allowing seven runs (3 earned) as the North built a 7-2 lead.

Gayle re-entered the game in the seventh in relief of Shannon Williams from Towers and sat down the next six North batters, including three more strikeouts to break former Southwest DeKalb player Jada Jefferies record of 16 set in the inaugural All-Star Classic in 2005.

Gayle finished 1-4 at the plate and scored two runs, including the winner, in the eighth inning's 10-run rally to go along with her record setting strikeout performance (17) on the mound to earn the South's Most Valuable Player award.

Chamblee's Erin Bell earned the North's MVP award as she struck out an All-Star Classic fourth best of 10 batters and allowed just three earned runs while walking none (All-Star Classic low). She was 2-3 at the plate and scored three runs.

2011 GAME RECAP

North rallies for 11-9 victory over South

The North All-Stars fell behind 7-0 in the first two and half innings before rallying to defeat the South All-Stars 11-9 in the seventh annual DeKalb County Senior All-Star Softball Classic at Dunwoody on Monday.

The South took advantage of four North errors two hits and two RBIs by Southwest DeKalb's Trenece Nash, and a RBI single by Stephenson's Tatyana Givens to build the 7-0 advantage.

The North countered with an unearned run in the bottom of the third as Lakeside's Susanne Boden singled and scored her first of three runs in the game due to an error and a couple of wild pitches to break into the scoring column at 7-1.

Nash, the South MVP, got the run back in the fourth as she hit the first ever homerun in the All-Star Classic, a towering shot into the trees in right-center field to make it 8-1.

The North cut the lead to 8-4 with three runs in the bottom of the fourth keyed by a two-out, RBI double by Dunwoody's Elyse Ferguson.

Trailing 9-4 in the bottom of the sixth, the North struck for four runs behind another RBI single by Ferguson, a ground out RBI by Lucy Mason of Chamblee and Boden hit the second ever homerun in All-Star history, another solo shot to right field to pull the North within 9-8.

Lakeside's Meagan Brickhouse tied the game at 9-9 in the bottom of the seventh with a RBI single to score Jessie Bragg.

A two-run eighth put the North ahead to stay as Mason reached on an error, stole second and came in to score on a wild pitch for the 10-9 North lead. Bragg singles to score Boden with two out in the inning for the final of 11-9.

Druid Hills pitcher Ashton Salazar pitched the final four innings to get the win as she held the South scoreless over the final three as the North rallied to take the lead. Salazar struck out four and walked one in allowing just one run in the sixth as she pitched in relieve of starter Jessie Bragg of Chamblee.

Shawna Wilson of Southwest DeKalb gave up two unearned runs in taking the loss for the South in relief of starter Shantelle Smith of Cedar Grove who went six innings.

Lakeside's Susanne Boden was 3-4 with a double, homerun, scored three runs and had one RBI to earn the North MVP honors. Jessie Bragg was 3-5 with two runs scored, two stolen bases and one RBI while Meagan Brickhouse (Lakeside) was 2-2 with one run scored, one RBI and one stolen base and Dunwoody's Elyse Ferguson was 2-5 with two runs scored, a double and two RBIs.

Southwest DeKalb's Trenece Nash was 4-5 with four RBIs to set the All-Star Classic record for hits and RBIs in a game to go with her homerun, the first in seven All-Star Classics. Stephenson's Tatyana Givens joined Nash in the multiple hit category with a 3-3 performance, three runs scored, one RBI, two walks and two stolen bases.

North evens series at 4-4 with 12-4 victory

The North All-Star pitching staff struck out 19 batters and the offense had 11 hits on the way to a 12-4 victory over the South in the 8th Annual DeKalb County Senior All-Star Softball Classic at Lakeside on Monday.

The South had its only lead of the game in the first inning at 1-0 when they scored a run despite Lakeside's Marie Collop striking out four batters in the inning. Arabia Mountain's Tynetta Muhammad walked to start the game and moved around to score via a wild pitch and a passed ball.

Collop settled in going on to strike out eight over her three innings of pitching as the North built a lead on the back of a five run outburst in the bottom of the first inning.

The five-run outburst in the bottom of the first to give the North All-Stars the lead for good was keyed by three South errors, a two-run single by Collop and a bunt single for a RBI by Lakeside's Sophia Baur-Waishord.

The lead increased to 7-1 over the next two innings as Whitney Dixon of Dunwoody hit a sacrifice fly to score Lakeside's Aubrey Blackstock in the second and Collop drew a bases loaded walk in the third to score Clarkston's Payal Patel.

Tucker's Rebecca Adams pitched the fourth and fifth innings striking out five and allowing just one base runner on a single by Tia Bolden of Arabia Mountain with two out in the fifth.

An one-out error and then a RBI groundout by Patel in the fourth pushed the lead to 9-1 and two more errors in the fifth allowed Dunwoody's Kimberly Mandeville to score after walking to lead off the inning for a 10-1 advantage.

Muhammad scored her second run of the game and Towers' Shantell Stephens scored another as a pair of North errors led to two sixth inning runs for the South to trim the lead to 10-3.

Two more errors in the seventh allowed Blackstock and Collop to score to extend the lead back to 12-3.

The South picked up its final run on Brianna Norfleet's RBI single to score Courtney Pringle who had reached on a bunt single and stole second to make the final score of 12-4.

Dunwoody's Stacey Ward closed out the game with back-to-back strikeouts to give her six in three innings of work.

Lakeside's Marie Collop was named the North's Most Valuable Player after striking out 8 in three innings of work, allowing just one unearned run, one walk, one hit while going 2-3 at the plate with three RBI and scoring a pair of runs in the 12-4 victory. It was the second consecutive season for a Lakeside selection to earn the MVP honors for the North All-Stars.

Lakeside's Sophia Baur-Waishord was 3-4 with an RBI for the North squad.

Lithonia's Brianna Norfleet was 1-4 at the plate and drove in one run while reaching base three times on the day to earn the South MVP honors. Norfleet became the first Lithonia All-Star selection to be named MVP.

Whyte powers Red Seniors to 15-3 Senior All-Star Classic victory

Arabia Mountain's Shaista Whyte drove in five runs on three hits to lead the Red Senior All-Stars to a 15-3 victory over the Blue in four innings of the DeKalb County Senior All-Star Softball Classic at Lakeside on Monday.

Whyte got started early as she batted third for the Red team and delivered a two-run double in her first at bat of the game. Jordyn Saxton of Stephenson also had a double two batters later to score Whyte and came around to score following an error and wild pitch to give the Red a 4-1 lead.

Red pitcher Alexis Smoot of Arabia Mountain would allow just one hit in the game, a first inning triple by Nyla Roberts of Southwest DeKalb, and just three runs. She worked out of jams in the second and third innings.

Miller Grove's Ayanna Gordon hit a two-run single in the third to expand the lead to 6-1.

The Blue cut the lead to 6-3 in top of the fourth against Smoot as they loaded the bases with one out on three consecutive walks. Columbia's Alexis Crawford pushed across the second run of the game for the Blue with a bases-loaded walk and Jada Byrd's fielder's choice pushed across a second run.

Whyte and the Red team closed out the game in the fourth inning striking for nine runs taking advantage of seven walks, a hit batsmen and an error.

Whyte singled in one run with no outs and on her second at bat of the inning drove in two more with another single to end the game. Jordyn Saxton and Bria Scott of Stephenson both drove in runs with bases-loaded walks and Clarkston's LaCaya Earle was hit-by-a-pitch with the bases loaded to drive in another run.

The All-Star Classic had two new records set this year with Whyte and Decatur's Harper Reed putting their names at the top of the record lists. Whyte broke the RBI record of 4 set by Trencece Nash of Southwest DeKalb in the 2011 game with her 5 RBIs in the game.

Reed walked four consecutive times in the game to break the record of two in a game set by several players in the Classic. Miller Grove's Shelby Eccles tied the stolen base mark of three in the game set by Southwest DeKalb's Raven Johnson in 2007.

Ayanna Gordon was the only other player in the game to have multiple hits besides Whyte as she went a perfect 2-2 on the game.

Whyte was named the Red MVP for her performance and Nyla Roberts was named the Blue team MVP as she went 1-2 at the plate with a triple and run scored.

The Red-Blue format is in its first season and the Red now holds a 1-0 lead in the series. The North and South format was tied 4-4 in the first 8 Classics played.

Extra base hits power Red over Blue

Eight extra base hits powered the Red All-Stars to a 24-3 victory over the Blue All-Stars in the 10th Annual DeKalb County Senior All-Star Softball Classic on Monday at Stephenson High School.

Catriona Geddes of Dunwoody got the Blue off to an early 1-0 lead in the top of the first with the first of her three hits in the game to drive in Dunwoody teammate Haley Pierce.

The Red answered with three runs in the bottom of the first inning on the first of the extra hits as Towers' Nicole Valcarcel slapped a two-run double and later scored on an error. It gave the Red a 3-1 lead it would never relinquish.

LaKaylin Lee of Miller Grove had a RBI triple in the second as the lead expanded to 6-1. The Blue trimmed the lead to 6-2 as Dunwoody's Alyssa Viness walked and later scored on a passed ball in the top of the third.

Lee added a two-run triple in the third inning to go with a two-run double by Tandy Conyers of Miller Grove and a solo homer by Ashleigh Dennis as the lead expanded to 14-2. Lee's triple made her the first player in the history of the All-Star Classic to have two triples in the game while Dennis became just the third person to hit a homerun in the Classic.

Conyers (5 RBI) added the fourth homerun in the history of the game with a three-run shot over the fence and two batters later Valcarcel hit the fifth homer of the Classic with a two-run stroke to push the lead to 19-2.

Lee put two more runs on the board in the fifth with a two-run double, her third extra base hit of the game, while teammates Valcarcel (5 RBI) and Jasmine Jackson of Martin Luther King Jr. had RBI singles to push the lead to 24-2.

Geddes put the final run of the game on the board for the Blue with a hard hit line drive to left for a triple to drive in Druid Hills' Kayla Cato who had beat out an infield grounder for a hit.

Lee was named the Red MVP after going 3-3 with 5 RBI, 2 triples, 1 double, two walks, scored 5 runs and was the winning pitcher after going the first three innings with three strikeouts. Decatur's Anna Marianchuk went the final four innings on the mound for the Red with 7 strikeouts, one walk with two hits and one run allowed.

Geddes finished the day 3-3 with the triple and two RBI to be named the Blue MVP. Redan's Jaylen Black pitched the first two innings to take the loss while Druid Hills' Nicole Gilkeson struck out five batters in three innings of relief and walked none despite giving up 13 unearned runs, 18 runs total. Decatur's Summer Sullivan pitched the final inning for the Blue and struck out two of the three batters she faced.

The Red now leads the series 2-0 after winning the inaugural Red-Blue game last year.

The DeKalb County Blue Senior Softball All-Stars ended the two game streak of the Red All-Stars with a 7-3 victory at Lakeside on Monday.

The Red had won the DeKalb County All-Star Softball Classic the past two seasons by scores of 15-3 and 24-3 and jumped to an early 1-0 lead in the bottom of the first on a RBI double by Stephenson's Shayla Smith that plated Stephenson teammate Nailah Manning who had reached on an error.

Southwest DeKalb's Taylor Roberts got out of the inning without further damage and went on to limit the Red to just two more hits and two more runs as she went the distance on the mound for the Blue.

The DCSD Red Senior All-Stars used big third and fourth inning rallies to knock off the Blue Seniors 15-8 in the 12th Annual DCSD Softball Senior All-Star Classic on Wednesday at Chamblee.

Leading 3-1 heading into the bottom of the fourth inning the Red exploded for 6 runs keyed by a two-run double off the bat of Miller Grove's Lashayna Lee and a RBI double from Decatur's Olivia Brozek. Lakeside's Taylor Parker drove in a run on a ground out in the inning as the Red extended the lead to 9-1.
