Montclair makes no sense. It's impossible for areas that aren't directly on Clairmont to easily access the school. There's a creek separating the Buford Highway area from the school. G and H should go to John Lewis along with any other residential areas along Buford Highway.

It is a logistical nightmare - it is dividing the community by cutting up areas of Buford highway and Clairmont. My community is split in this version - you take all the apartments/townhomes in the Clairmont Terrace/Tanglewood area but leave out the Single Family homes - Major Transportation concerns and proximity concerns for students

TANGLEWOOD/GREGORY RUN IS NOT INCLUDED.

You are putting more focus on apartment complexes than single family homes. Tanglewood/Gregory Run wants to be in JRL and many of these folks do NOT. The parents of Tanglewood/Gregory Run are invested and will support and help make the school great. YOU NEED US.

If Area I stayed at Woodward or moved to JLES, perhaps Brookhaven Renaissance could stay at APS as they prefer. Also, Gregory Run/Tanglewood Circle would like to move to JLES rather than stay at Montclair if possible.

Students from southwest part of districts have to travel considerably to new John Lewis, despite being right next to Montclair.

Still cuts several neighborhoods in half...

Let the children go to the school that is closest to our neighborhood. In the event of the emergency it would be easier to get these kids home.

Still the same ES attending Cross Keys HS with a long skinny attendance zone with longer travel distances. Now is the chance to redraw the high school lines to eliminate the long attendance zone that has not served the Cross Keys students for too many years.

It seems that there will be multiple buses needed for getting kids from Woodward to drive directly past Montclair Elementary. This up and down the already over-travelled Clairmont corridor. There is no sense in busing kids to the third nearest school to their geographic location.

Students that are redistricted being sent to schools where they may not speak the same first language of many other students.

Does not take enough kids and families from that area marked with a C who really truly want to attend JLES. That area marked with a C should be bigger like on option 1.

Pushes Wakefield Forest, which has historically had less children and older residents, into an overcrowded Montgomery Elementary when the number of children coming to elementary school age in the neighborhood is rapidly increasing and projected enrollment high.

Wakefield Forest also geographically closer than E.2

Adds too many students to Chamblee MS & HS. K area is very close in distance to Cross Keys, it doesn't make sense to send to Chamblee.

Creates a skinnier attendance zone for JLES. Many Montclair families would stay zoned for Montclair that want to be in JLES. Less walkability for families with a skinnier attendance zone.

It's still leaves Cross Keys gerrymandered. The entire area needs to be redistricted from Montgomery down to Briar Vista needs to be adjusted. The county took the oath of least resistance.

Breaks up too many neighborhoods, creates an odd layout for attendance zones and makes busing difficult.

I do not agree with/support your plans to split the "Skyland Estates" Neighborhood from the rest of Brookhaven and move the HS students from Chamblee HS to Cross Keys. This decision is not supported by the criteria you claim to be using in your decision making process.

Don't see many...

There was supposed to be a third option. I would advocate hard for keeping the current Ashford Park attendance zone in place, but, at a minimum, leaving Skyland (north of Dresden), Carlton, and Bamby, which are in Ashford Park, in Ashford Park elementary, is a MUST.
