Chamblee Middle School was founded in 1997 and moved into the current building in 2006. In Spring of 2019, Chamblee students scored **93.6 in Content Mastery** (ELA/96, Math/92, Science/84, Social Studies/100), **87.3 in Progress**, **100 in Closing Gaps** (an increase of 52 pts), and **92 in Readiness**, resulting in an overall **CCRPI of 92**. We are the "A" school that we envision. Additionally, we achieved a 5-Star Climate Rating (score of 92) as a safe and substance-free school that children want to attend.

Our 2020 faculty and staff includes 70 highly qualified full-time teachers, one Media Specialist, a half-time media clerk, an instructional technology support specialist, ten paraprofessionals, three counselors, four administrators (one per grade level and principal), four administrative assistants, bookkeeper, registrar, one school Food Services manager and two assistants, one Plant Engineer, three custodial employees, a School Resource Officer (SRO), and two campus supervisors.
