SWD MAGNET PROGRAM FOR HIGH ACHIEVERS

Southwest DeKalb High School is an academic powerhouse. As such, it is home to the High Achievers Magnet Program. Along with the resident students, the school hosts an enrollment of over 1170 well rounded students. Consistently, Southwest DeKalb students receive thousands of dollars in college scholarships for academics as well as athletics.

More than half of our faculty and staff have advanced degrees. Several of our teachers are veteran educators with more than ten years of experience. Southwest DeKalb has four teachers which are AP Exam Readers (there are approximately 140 in the entire county) as selected by the college board. Our teachers are committed to educating all students who enter their classrooms and many of them extend themselves beyond the normal school day by serving as coaches or sponsors of extra-curricular activities.

Southwest DeKalb offers many programs that increase the rigor of course work for our students. Students who participate in the program are selected based upon their grades and standardized test scores.

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are college courses that are offered in high school.

The Magnet Programs are designed to offer students unique educational opportunities to build each student's academic talents, interests, and abilities. The administrators and instructors of the various magnet programs instill high academic expectations in all students. The differentiated instructional strategies and techniques utilized by the staff members of the magnet programs help our students to experience challenging and stimulating opportunities to ensure academic success while participating in the magnet program.

We have instituted programs such as a Ninth Grade Academy, Advisement Tutorials, Departmental Tutorials, Saturday School, and the Kaplan SAT Review in an effort to increase performances on standardized tests, including the Georgia Milestone Test, Advanced Placement Exams, the SAT, and the ACT. Test scores on the English and Writing portions of the Georgia High School Graduation Test were consistently high and ranked among the top ten in the county. Additionally, we offer a variety of extra-curricular activities for all students, including community service organizations, honor societies, athletic teams, marching, jazz, and concert bands, debate teams, academic clubs. Our marching band has received numerous national and international honors. The Georgia Music Educators

Association has rated the Southwest DeKalb bands and ensembles superior in performance for 23 consecutive years. For the fourth year in a row, Southwest DeKalb received top athletic honors for excelling in all sports. Academically, we have established ourselves as a powerhouse by being internationally recognized for the last ten years as the school that has the largest number of African-Americans in the world to score three or better on the AP U.S. History exam. Our faculty and staff members sacrifice many hours to nurture students inside and outside of the classroom. Our PTSA, business and community leaders work closely with the teachers and administrative staff to help us achieve our academic and financial goals.

SWD MAGNET ELIGIBILITY

All applicants for the high achiever's magnet program must have a Fall semester 3.0 (or higher) grade point average (GPA) in the core subjects. DeKalb students must also earn a 75th percentile (or higher) total reading score, 75th percentile (or higher) total math score on the baseline M.A.P. assessment taken in the school year 2020-2021.

All students not enrolled in a DeKalb County School District school must also earn a 75th percentile (or higher) total reading score, 75th percentile (or higher) total math score on the baseline M.A.P. assessment taken in the school year 2020-2021. Students applying for the high school high achiever's magnet programs must also successfully complete grade level prerequisite courses.

Students enrolled in the magnet programs for high achievers must maintain an overall numerical core average of 80, a numerical minimum grade of 71 in all core subjects, and meet the promotion criteria each semester. Students who do not maintain the academic performance criteria are placed on probation for one semester.
