
### WHY REDISTRICTING?



- Replacement 950-seat Pleasantdale Elementary School
  - Opening Fall 2020
  - About 350 seats of additional capacity (Current Enrollment: 637)

## WHY REDISTRICTING?

Balance elementary enrollment in the Lakeside Cluster



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- Community meeting process
  - Everyone participates equally
  - Meetings starts with large group presentation
  - Divide into small-group break-out sessions
  - Small-groups facilitated by trained staff
  - Equity in the process
  - Focused discussion on the criteria

- First Round Lakeside HS September 24, 2019
  - Objective: Collect community input within the board approved criteria
- Second Round Lakeside HS– October 15, 2019
  - Objective: Collect community input on presented redistricting options based on board approved criteria
- Third Round Lakeside HS— November 18, 2019
  - Objective: Collect community input on Staff
     Recommended Plan based on board approved criteria

- All options presented would go into effect in August 2020
- Students rising into 5<sup>th</sup> grade will have the option to continue in their former school, with no transportation provided

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## REDISTRICTING CRITERIA

- Board Policy AD: Alteration of School Attendance Areas defines primary and secondary criteria
- Primary Criteria, based on logistics
  - Geographic proximity
  - Instructional capacity
  - Projected enrollment

Note: Students may not always be assigned to their closest school, since other criteria must also be considered.

### REDISTRICTING CRITERIA

- Secondary Criteria, when the primary criteria indicate more than one option for action
  - Safety and traffic patterns
  - Previous redistricting
  - Intact neighborhoods
  - Special programs
  - Condition of facility
  - School feeder alignment
  - Efficient and economical operations

# ROUND 1 SMALL-GROUP FEEDBACK QUESTIONS

- 1. What safety and traffic concerns do you have that redistricting could affect?
- 2. What community areas, such as homeowners or civic associations, should be considered as part of the intact neighborhood criterion?
- 3. What residential development are you concerned will influence the enrollment forecasts?
- 4. Should we look at redistricting of elementary schools in the Lakeside cluster, further away, such as Sagamore Hills ES, Oak Grove ES, and Briarlake ES?

## ROUND 1 SMALL-GROUP FEEDBACK GROUND RULES

- Can only consider input related to the criteria
- DCSD commits to receiving and considering all appropriate input
- Staff must balance multiple perspectives and logistical limitations in developing plans, thus not all input can be accommodated
