

Southwest DeKalb High School is an academic powerhouse. As such, it is home to the High Achievers Magnet Program. Along with the resident students the school hosts an enrollment of over 1100 well rounded students. Consistently, Southwest DeKalb students receive thousands of dollars in college scholarships for academics as well as athletics.

More than half of our faculty and staff have advanced degrees. Several of our teachers are veteran educators with more than ten years of experience. Southwest DeKalb has four teachers which are AP Exam Readers (there are only approximately 140 in the entire country) as selected by the College Board. Our teachers are committed to educating all students who enter their classrooms and many of them extend themselves beyond the normal school day by serving as coaches or sponsors of extracurricular activities.

Southwest DeKalb offers many programs that increase the rigor of course work for our students. Students who participate in the program are selected based upon their grades and standardized test scores.

Rising 9th Graders

Math level will be determined by current Criterion-Referenced Competency Tests (CRCT) scores or Measures of Academic Progress test (M.A.P).

Rising 10th Graders

Advanced English, General or Accelerated Math I, General or Advanced Biology, Beginning French or Spanish or German or Latin.

Rising 11th Graders:

Advanced English, General or Accelerated Math II, General or Advanced Chemistry, French or Spanish or German or Latin.

Rising 12th Graders:

Advanced Core and World Language classes beyond the eleventh grade requirements.

We have instituted programs such as the Ninth Grade Academy, Advisement Tutorials, Departmental Tutorials, Saturday School, and the Kaplan SAT Review, which have resulted in increased performances on standardized tests, including the Georgia Milestone, Advanced Placement Exams, the SAT, and the ACT. Scores on the English and Writing portions of the Georgia High School Graduation Test are consistently high and rank among the top ten in the county.

SWD offers a variety of extra-curricular activities, including community service organizations, honor societies, athletic teams, marching, jazz, and concert bands, debate teams, academic clubs. Our marching band has received numerous national and international honors. The Georgia Music Educators Association has rated the Southwest DeKalb bands and ensembles superior in performance for 24 consecutive years. Southwest DeKalb has consistently received top county athletic honors for excelling in all sports. Academically, Southwest DeKalb is distinguished and has been recognized by the College Board as an Exemplary AP Honor School as a result of the school's historical performance on the various Advance Placement Exams. Our faculty and staff work diligently to nurture students inside and outside of the classroom. Our PTSA, business and community leaders work closely with the teachers and administrative staff to help us achieve our academic and financial goals.

The Magnet Programs are designed to offer students unique educational opportunities to build each student's academic talents, interests, and abilities. The administrators and instructors of the various magnet programs instill high academic expectations in all students. The differentiated instructional strategies and techniques utilized by the staff members of the magnet programs help our students to experience challenging and stimulating opportunities to ensure academic success while participating in the magnet program.
