Coralwood has a very diverse population of students with and without disabilities. Students with autism, Down syndrome, orthopedic impairments, medical impairments, visual impairments, hearing impairments, and intellectual disabilities are educated with typically developing students. Children learn from each other at Coralwood and each child's unique gifts are celebrated.

Our research-based educational model includes 12 inclusion classrooms of students with special needs and typically developing students, and 4 self-contained classrooms. Our PreK and Kindergarten inclusion classes are co-taught with full time special ed. and general ed. teachers. Our preschool inclusion classes have a maximum class size of 16 students, PreK inclusion has 18 students, and Kindergarten inclusion classes have a maximum class size of 20 students.

- Students with special needs are assigned by East DeKalb Campus. Bus service is provided.
- Typically developing students are chosen through the School Choice Lottery. Parents must provide transportation. <u>All typical students must be</u> fully potty trained.

PreK & Kindergarten hours: 8:00-2:30

Our preschool and PreK students learn through play. The GELDS (Georgia Early Learning and Development Standards) curriculum is developmentally appropriate for these young children. Our Kindergarten students follow the statewide GSE (Georgia Standards of Excellence) curriculum. All of our teachers are highly qualified and certified.

All students participate in "Specials" which include Art, Music, Motor/PE, and Library. Daily recess and numerous opportunities for physical movement are provided throughout the day.

Coralwood School has 2 completely fenced adaptive playgrounds, an accessible nature trail, several outdoor classrooms, classroom gardens, and other fun outdoor areas on the campus.

Coralwood School has a very active and supportive Coralwood PTO and Coralwood Foundation. Through their support, a wonderful variety of "in-school field trips" and cultural arts programs are provided to enhance the educational program for our students.
