These elements of all IB Programmes help students become lifelong, globally-minded learners.



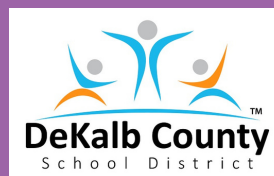
Approaches to Learning- Deliberate strategies, skills and attitudes that permeate the IB learning environment.



Learner Profile- Ten traits that help to define who IB learners are and who they are striving to become.



International mindedness- Understanding, respecting, and valuing different cultures. This helps students embrace diversity and understand that despite our differences, we can understand one another.



The IB Career-related Programme is a framework of international education designed for students interested in career-related learning while in high school. It combines career-related coursework and examinations with courses from the Diploma Programme to prepare students for college, careers, and lifelong learning.

Career-related Programme Subjects

Students complete the program during 11th and 12th grade:

The Career-related Programme Core

Career-related Programme Core

CP core experiences expand students' critical thinking career-related skills, and personal agency.



Personal and Professional Skills- A course designed to enhance students' attitudes and aptitudes to be applied to personal and professional contexts



Reflective project- research and writing on an ethical issue in student's career pathway



Service Learning- developing the knowledge and skills to meet an authentic community need



Language Development- students document their development of a second language

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DCSD CP Cluster

The International Baccalaureate authorized its first DeKalb County School District IB Career-related Programmes in 2021 at Tucker High School. Students wishing to join the IB Career-related Programme must apply to the Tucker IB Cluster. From PreK- grade 8, admissions are determined by lottery. Rising 9th-11th graders must meet admissions criteria.

- Brockett Elementary School (IB Primary Years Candidate School)
- Tucker Middle School (IB Middle Years Programme)
- Tucker High School (IB Career-related and Diploma Programmes)

Benefits of the IB Career-related Programme

The International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme is recognized for preparing students for a successful transition from high school into either further academic study or entry into a career.

- **CP is international.** Students are exposed to international perspectives on their career and academic studies.
- **CP is comprehensive.** It helps students learn to analyze and reflect on their academic and career-related studies and service experiences.
- **CP teaches transferable skills.** It prioritizes lifelong skills in applied knowledge, critical thinking, communication, and cross-cultural engagement.

Admission process

IB Preparatory Program for Rising 9th and 10th grade

Students must have:

- 3.0 GPA
- 1 credit of Spanish or French by the end of 10th grade
- Complete School Choice and IB applications

IB Career-related Programme for Rising 11th grade

Students must have:

- 3.2 GPA
- 1 credit of Spanish or French
- Completed first course of career pathway
- Complete School Choice and IB applications
