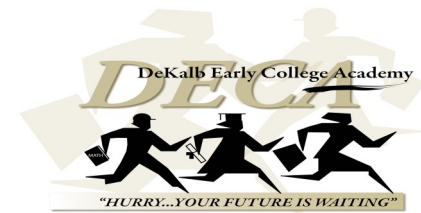

What is DECA?

DECA was established in 2006. It is a School of Choice and the DeKalb County School District's only Early College model high school. In conjunction with Georgia State University, our students complete two years of high school education (9th and 10th grade) on our campus and their last two years (11th and 12th grade) as full-time students at Georgia State University at Perimeter College. Through the state-funded Dual Enrollment program, students can earn 30 semester hours with little to no cost. Upon completion, students will receive their high school diploma, with a possibility of earning both the diploma and an Associates degree.

Who is eligible to attend?

We look for:

- Students who may be first in their family to attend/graduate college; under-represented populations to the college experience
- Students who may or may not be eligible for free/reduced lunch
- Students who have the drive to be successful with a rigorous college preparatory curriculum
- Students who enjoy academics and understand that we do not offer band or athletic programs (*except at your home school)

What advantages does DECA offer?

- ♦ Smaller class sizes than traditional high schools
- ♦ Opportunity to get a head start on college
- ♦ Student-centered Learning Environment
- ♦ Standards Based Classrooms
- ♦ Six Common Instructional Practices enforced in all classrooms:
 - ♦ Classroom Talk
 - ♦ Collaborative Group Work
 - ♦ Writing to Learn
 - ♦ Literacy Groups/Circles
 - ♦ Questioning Strategies
 - ♦ Scaffolding

3. Sealed copy of Discipline, Academic, and Attendance Transcripts
4. Teacher/Counselor Recommendation Letter
5. Scores on the 7th, 8th, or 9th grade Georgia Milestones (or alternate standardized assessment based on previous enrollment).
